

Day Trips (Hikes, Park Days, City Outings)



Day trips are about convenience and comfort. You don't need the whole house, but the essentials keep your pet safe and happy.

Basics & Comfort

- Water bottle (collapsible travel bottle or dispenser)
- Portable bowl
- Treat pouch (easy-access for training or rewards)
- Poop bags / scoop
- Cooling mat or portable blanket (car, park picnics)
- Pet-safe wipes (mud, paws, quick clean-ups)

Safety & ID

- Secure collar + ID tag with current number
- Harness (escape-proof if cat)
- Leash (short for city, long-line for park/hike)
- GPS tracker (optional but great for open areas)
- Car seatbelt harness / booster seat

Day Trips (Hikes, Park Days, City Outings)



Enrichment & Fun

- Chew toy or travel-safe toy
- Ball / frisbee for dogs
- Scratcher / toy mouse for cats if they come along
- Shade solution (umbrella, pop-up tent if outdoors long)

Health & Emergencies

- Mini first-aid kit (bandages, tweezers for thorns, antiseptic wipes)
- Any required meds (like anxiety drops)
- Vet contact saved in your phone (just in case)

 **RULE OF THUMB: PACK AS IF YOUR DAY COULD TURN INTO AN OVERNIGHT UNEXPECTEDLY.**

Local Travel (Road Trips, Staycations, Weekend Getaways)



Longer than a day trip, local travel needs extra comfort, health prep, and emergency planning.

Basics & Comfort

- All day-trip essentials
- Bed or blanket that smells like home
- Extra water bottles (at least 2–3L for hot climates)
- Extra food portions (plus treats for comfort)
- Portable litter box + litter (for cats)
- Car hammock / barrier (protect seats, keep pets safe)
- Cooling vest / jacket (seasonal needs)

Safety & ID

- Updated ID tags (double-check phone number works locally)
- Extra leash/harness (back-up in case of breakage)
- Car crate or travel carrier (for longer drives)
- Window shades (prevent overheating in car)
- Pet seatbelt clip

Local Travel (Road Trips, Staycations, Weekend Getaways)



Enrichment & Fun

- Puzzle feeder (hotel boredom buster)
- Familiar toys (rotated to keep novelty)
- Travel scratching post / collapsible playpen (cats)
- Hiking gear (dog boots, trail pack if hiking)

Health & Emergencies

- Expanded first-aid kit (gauze, antiseptic spray, tick remover)
- Flea/tick preventives (apply before traveling rural)
- Medications + full dosage supply
- Contact list of vets along your route + at destination
- Pet insurance details (check coverage outside your city)
- Backpack / Sling and Muzzle to carry pet incase of injury

 **PRO TIP: MAP PET-FRIENDLY REST STOPS OR DOG PARKS ALONG YOUR ROUTE BEFORE LEAVING.**

Flights & International Relocation



This is the big one — high-stakes, high-stress, and requires serious preparation. Think documents, safety, comfort, and contingencies.

Documents & Legal

- Pet passport(s)
- Vaccination certificates (rabies + core)
- Microchip certificate
- Import/export permits
- Vet health certificate (within required timeframe)
- Airline paperwork (fit-to-fly, transit docs)
- Copies of all paperwork (print + digital)
- Emergency contacts (vets at both ends)

Basics & Comfort

- IATA-approved airline crate (with absorbent pad, ID info)
- Familiar blanket / shirt with home scent
- Calming pheromone spray / wipes

Flights & International Relocation



- Attached water bowl inside crate
- Small, safe chew toy (nothing that could choke)
- Extra food packed in checked luggage (2–4 weeks' worth if relocating)
- Treats for arrival comfort
- Litter tray + litter ready at destination

Safety & ID

- Collar with ID tag (international phone + email)
- Microchip registered with global database
- Escape-proof harness & leash for airport handling
- GPS tracker (battery charged for arrival)

Health & Emergencies

- First-aid kit (full)
- Medications + prescriptions (enough for months if relocating)
- Flea/tick/heartworm preventives (climate-specific)

Flights & International Relocation



- Contact list of vets in destination country (research ahead)
- Pet insurance with international coverage

Settling In

- Pet clause in rental contract checked
- Pet-proofing (screens, gates, safe zones)
- Catio or secure outdoor setup (if allowed)
- Local adoption/rescue contacts (for emergencies, resources)
- Pet shops & suppliers mapped out
- Boarding/daycare researched in advance

 **PLAN CRATE TRAINING AT LEAST 6–8 WEEKS BEFORE FLIGHT — STRESS IS LOWER WHEN PETS ARE CRATE-FAMILIAR.**
